As you know, there are many different types of books! By using classification labels, readers will find more easily what interest them.

Helping your users make successful choices! The visualisation and selection of the one true book can be difficult. Navigating in library spaces is often a tricky endeavour to the untrained eye. Classification labels will help your users find the type of book that interest them. They can identify various themes found in the same categorie. By using classification labels, reader's will feel more confident and independent in their selection. This is a way to guiding them through your library. Classification labels would serve as an efficient shortcut for your readers browsing experience.

Classification labels also make your space friendlier to inexperienced or young visitors! It offers many possibilities for teachers to discuss specific subjects with their students.

Starting this kind of project is definitely no small task. Having to assign new categories, labels, signage and having to physically move the books do seem like a lot of work but the increase in traffic makes it worth your time. We don't want you to feel restricted when you use the classification labels. Books should not be trapped in one single category but in various categories. For instance books can be grouped by content, setting, suspense, tone or comedy...

Categories in School Libraries

The positioning of your books has to be influenced by category but also by difficulty level, so that any child can find a book that interests them regardless of their age or their reading capacity.

The process behind changing your Library

Using classification labels is no small task! Documenting the process would help you see how your space has evolved. Look up which types and categories of books are being checked out frequently and start from there. We suggest asking your users how they feel browsing the shelves. Do they feel confident when looking for a book? Do they find what they are looking for? What strategies do they use to navigate your library? What are their favorite types? You could even take before and after pictures to share your ideas and progress.




